

### **Free School Meals**

You may be eligible for funding for a hot lunch. In addition, school may access funding through Pupil Premium Grant. The pupil premium is extra money for schools to help disadvantaged pupils of all abilities achieve their full potential. School receives £1,480 towards extra support for eligible children. When you are eligible for free meals, this grant is also given to school. All children in Reception up to Yr 2 may access a free hot meal. However, only those applying through Suffolk for Free School Meals will trigger the additional funding to school. There is an online checker available on the Suffolk Website to see if you are eligible. Apply for free school meals - Suffolk County Council

You must apply for a primary school place for the 2025/2026 school year by the closing date of 15th January 2025. We are always available to show families around. We have had many more enquiries this year than before, so please get your application in on time.

library open after school on some days, subject to staffing.






# NEW CATHOLIC BOOK SWAP SHELF FOR BIBLE STORIES AND PRAYER BOOKS

### Jubilee 2025 'Pilgrims of Hope'

Pope Francis has decided that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, something which happens every 25 years.

The theme is "Pilgrims of Hope", and is a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis.

Preparations for the 2025 Year of Jubilee began in Advent 2023, which marked the start of a year of prayer. The Bishops' Conference have produced resources for the preparatory year of prayer, focusing on the Our Father, as well as resources about Jubilee in the Catholic Church.

"Jubilee" is the name given to a particular year. A time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation.




