Christmas in the School Kitchen



Victoria and Helena are busy planning the annual Christmas Lunch. This will be served on Wednesday 18th December. We'll all

gather in the school hall, with phases eating together for their sitting. Victoria and her team will be working hard to make this celebration a great one for our children. We are so thrilled to welcome our nursery children to join us in the celebrations. The children come to the school hall for lunch daily as part of their preparations for Primary School.

As usual, school dinner registers will be taken on the morning of 18th December and children should let their Teacher know if they would like a Christmas Lunch or have a packed lunch from home. The cost will be £2.30 which is payable by topping up your child's dinner account on Arbor (free to children in Reception up to Year 2 and those entitled to free school meals).

Children can come to school dressed in their party clothes that day (no football kits please).

Free School Meals

You may be eligible for funding for a hot lunch. In addition, school may access funding through Pupil Premium Grant. The pupil premium is extra money for schools to help disadvantaged pupils of all abilities achieve their full potential. School receives £1,480 towards extra support for eligible children. When you are eligible for free meals, this grant is also given to school. All children in Reception up to Yr 2 may access a free hot meal. However, only those applying through Suffolk for Free School Meals will trigger the additional funding to school. There is an online checker available on the Suffolk Website to see if you are eligible. Apply for free school meals - Suffolk County Council

You must apply for a primary school place for the 2025/2026 school year by the closing date of 15 January 2025. We are always available to show families around. We have had many more enquiries this year than before, so please get your application in on time.

Bishop Peter will celebrate Mass for school on 21st March 2025

Bishop Peter has kindly agreed to celebrate Mass for the whole school, families and parishioners on 21st March. This will be followed by a blessing of the new Sisters of St Louis Wellbeing Hub. Sister Blathnaid from the St Louis Sisters will be flying over from Ireland to join us too.

The Sisters have funded this mental wellbeing hub and we have been sending regular updates about progress.

Eco Classrooms and Nurseries arrived on site in late November and work began with great pace. The building has arrived in sections and is built on site within our courtyard, beside the library. Made using highly insulated construction, the building will need little energy to use. There will be a walkway all around the light-filled room and calm areas for children to go.

The multi-purpose space will be used for parent outreach and workshops, therapies for children, a sensory space and a place to meet with other wellbeing professionals. Located in a courtyard, the building will have skylight views of the sky, be surrounded by a walkway to sit and be calm within and have wide glazed doors that allow the internal room to open up to the outside. We are currently approaching charities to assist us in purchasing the furniture and sensory equipment that we'd like to use in this new room, pots and planting for outdoors. If you know of potential sponsors, please let us know.

We have taken the reception children over to see the building grow. They loved seeing the giant screws that have been drilled into the ground to create a platform for the base of the hub to sit upon.





OUR PRAYERS DURING THE

We to continue come together as a whole school for lighting of our Advent wreath in the hall this year. We come together in prayer in many ways.

On Mondays we hold Gospel Assemblies in the hall with children leading some of the prayers.

On Tuesdays, we hold Celebration Assembly on alternate weeks for KS1 and Reception or KS2. Wednesday is a time for prayer in class. On Thursdays, children sing together in the hall. Our Year 6 Chaplains help prepare and lead Friday whole school assemblies. We use TenTen Catholic resources to support our daily classroom prayer life and each day starts with a reflection and prayer linked to the Monday assembly theme of the Gospel. Children are being increasingly supported to lead and develop the prayer life in their classrooms and wider school. Each class has their own advent wreath as a symbols of Advent and stimulus for prayer and reflection.

Mental Wellbeing Support

From time to time, children in school become anxious. We have many ways to support each individual child to meet their distinct needs. Mrs Wyatt and Mrs Conway are our named Mental Health Leads in school and Emily Burbridge is our Lead Safeguarding Governor who oversees our school wide wellbeing support. We have Mental Health First Aiders in every phase who look out for signs of anxiety, Drawing and Talking trained staff to support children over the longer term and wider special support that we may need to support families to access. We have a staff member trained in Sand Play Therapy and another in Lego Therapy.


Sometimes, external specialist trained adults come into school to support children too.
