We are part of Our Lady of Walsingham Multi-Academy Trust where we place Christ at the centre and children at the heart of all that we do. At St Louis, our mission is to be a school where we love to learn and learn to love. We use our Gospel values to guide us.

We are committed to following the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. This is an important agreement by countries who have promised to protect children's rights. The Convention on the Rights of the Child explains who children are; all their rights, and the responsibilities of governments. All the rights are connected; they are all equally important and they cannot be taken away from children. Governors have signed a commitment to promoting these rights.

School's Responsibilities:

Provide a safe and secure learning environment

Set high standards of behaviour and learning

Provide a broad and balanced curriculum that meets the needs of all the children, giving them many opportunities for development of self and broader skills for success in life

Be friendly, open and welcoming

Recognise and reward good behaviour and achievement

Keep parents regularly informed about pupils' learning and development

Communicate concerns and successes to parents as early as possible and work to resolve difficulties promptly

Provide challenge and support according to needs

Provide access to a range of extra-curricular activities

Parents and Carers' Responsibilities:

To positively support the work of our Catholic school

To show respect for the Christian values of our community

Be supportive of our school behaviour policy as members of our Catholic community;

Help celebrate all that is positive and good in school and to reward good behaviour at home;

Contact school with any concerns or worries they have regarding their child to school as soon as possible;

Play an active role in discussions when children are finding it difficult to regulate their own behaviour and to work with the school in finding solutions;

To set a good example for their children

To support your child in completing their homework

To communicate concerns and successes to staff directly, as early as possible and work to resolve difficulties promptly

To recognise the importance of good attendance

To ensure their child arrives at and is collected from school, punctually

To report pupil absence on a daily basis

To attend parent consultation meetings

To support the school's policies and guidelines

To ensure their child travels to and from school in accordance with the school policy

To ensure their child is appropriately equipped, dressed in the correct school uniform and brings the correct PE kit.

To treat the school and members of the school community with respect, both on and off line and refrain from communicating negatively about any aspects of the school on social media Please note:

Before entering school, pupils' mobile phones must be switched off and handed into the class teacher. Smart watches and other electrical devices must be handed in too.

Jewellery should not be worn; however, a single set of stud earrings and an Analogue watch are acceptable. Make up and nail varnish should not be worn.

It is our rule that all pupils cycling and scootering to school, must wear a helmet for their safety and protection.

Children's responsibilities

Pupils are expected to follow the Behaviour Code of Conduct and to follow our school rules Children are expected to report behaviour that concerns, hurts or worries them to an adult

Accept the times when things go wrong or they make mistakes and move on quickly

Children will support and forgive each other when things go wrong

Children will be encouraged to be open to the idea of reconciliation

To strive to be the best that they can be in their behaviour and learning

To be friendly, polite and respectful to all pupils and adults in the school

To follow school rules

To attend school regularly, dressed smartly in the school uniform with the correct equipment

To report any bullying or unkindness, on or off line, immediately

To complete homework on time and recognise the importance of their studies

To look after school property, equipment and each other
